Our Tennessee State Parks are among the most beautiful in the United States. The Lodge at Pickwick Landing State Park in Chapel Hill, TN, is a preferred destination for business meetings and conferences and a vacation destination for families.

This position is responsible for leading the daily shifts in the kitchen, preparing meals for the food and beverage outlets, and banquet meetings. The preferred candidate will have knowledge of commercial kitchens and experience in high-volume restaurant operations. A ServSafe certification is required for this position within ninety days of employment. Candidates should be able to shift back and forth between two or more activities or sources of information (multitasking). It is a requirement of the position that a candidate is able to exert muscle force to lift, push, pull, or carry objects. The position requires work on weekends and holidays on a rotating basis. Highlighted Responsibilities:

- Operate a variety of commercial-grade kitchen appliances
- Bake bread, rolls, cakes, pies, and pastries
- Cleans, cuts, and cooks (by roasting, broiling, baking, and frying) meat, fish, poultry, and vegetables
- Coaches and trains new or less experienced workers in the kitchen
- Prepare restaurant meals to order in a timely manner to ensure guest satisfaction
- Prepare food for catered events as contracted by the Lodge
- Prioritize food prep tasks based on knowledge of the time needed to cook and prepare food items
- Maintain a clean and functional kitchen that exceeds the Department of Health expectations
