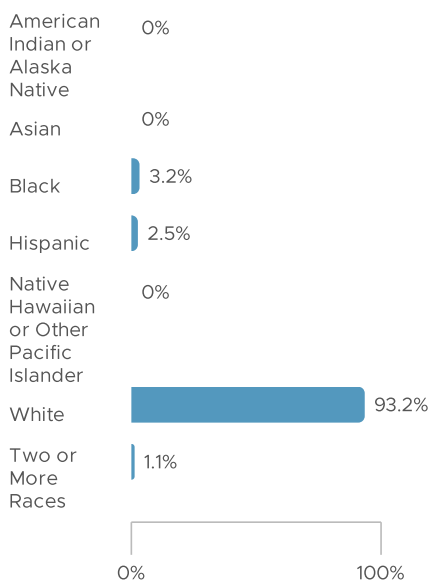

This metric indicates the number of cohort members the provider had in each of the three years represented in the Report Card.

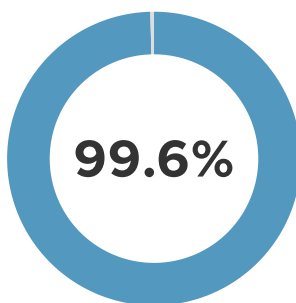
### Completers by Race

### Praxis Leader Licensure Pass Rate

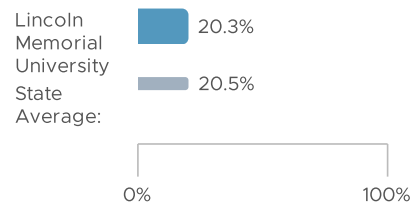
